



This month we begin our journey towards the Nativity. HUZZAH!

It appears to be no secret that I LOVE Christmas!

But...




November 15th is the start of the Nativity <u>FAST</u>. In our culture the run up to Christmas has become one hugely long festival of gluttony and self-indulgence. Most years it is all too easy to find Christmas parties anytime from October onwards, the shops are usually full of Christmas music, the shops are filled with Christmas food with "best before dates" well before the Feast begins.

Come December 25th in the evening people say to me "I'm glad it's all over!" One friend takes down her tree on 26th (having had it up since October), the radio a couple of years ago on 25th at about 4pm (I was on my way from one Christmas service to another) said "now that Christmas had ended..."

The <u>FEAST</u> of the Nativity begins after Vespers on Christmas Eve. It then carries on at least until Theophany and in many households until February 2nd (the Presentation of our Lord in the Temple).

So how can you prepare?



If you have an Orthodox calendar you will see that we have a relaxed fast until 11th December after which it is stricter. There are plenty of on-line calendars, so you have no excuse.

This year you are unlikely to be invited to office/ works etc. parties, so you don't need to worry about finding excuses this time. (I know of parishes that have Christmas parties in the fast!)

What about making an Orthodox Advent Calendar or an Orthodox Advent Tree? Starting from the bottom of your tree you add icons each day that are suitable (print out and stick them on card) until you reach the top branch on Christmas Even with the Nativity Icon and after Church add the Bethlehem Star to the top.



What about phoning a different friend or relative each day from 15th November to 25th December to wish them "Seasons Greetings". Or write/email each day in the same way? Try not to be surprised if they are delighted to hear from you.



What about giving a food or clothing gift to a food/clothing bank each day? There are LOTS of hungry, homeless, or poor people in our midst.

What about offering to help in your parish with the special cleaning, decorating, and preparing the Church for the Nativity? (Be careful about this – the usual team will likely die of shock).

What about deciding to volunteer for some local charity? (Lots to choose from.)

What about being nice to the person in the shop, behind the till, to the bus driver, to the office worker or to your next-door neighbour?

What about volunteering to baby sit your friend's children while they have a few moments away from their little cherubs?




What about making your Christmas presents this year? Jams, marmalades, chutneys, decorations, wines, cordials, knitted blankets, baby clothes, a manger scene and so on.

What about trying to smile from time to time?

Environment:

The winter birds are arriving now, the owls are making their usual din, the deer are barking, Roger the Rooster and his flock are looking good in his winter plumage. Gift Aid Information When the Stiperstones Trust receives a donation from a UK taxpayer, we are entitled to claim an amount of tax (calculated at the basic rate of income tax in that year) paid on that donation. Once you have given your permission for us to do this on your behalf (by filling in this Gift Aid form), there is no need for you to do anything else. All that is required is that you must be a taxpayer and that you would have paid or will pay enough Income and/or Capital Gains Tax to cover all the Gift Aid claimed on all your donations to all charities and Community amateur sports clubs in that tax year. Please note that it is your responsibility to pay any difference. The amount of tax we claim will be 25% of the total value of your donations in that tax year. Furthermore, if you are a higher taxpayer, you are also entitled to claim the difference between the basic rate which we will claim and the amount of tax you have actually paid. For further details on how you can do this, please contact your tax office.
